Description:

A competition for those who can bring the whole world into life with paper, glue and knife. So come up to join this event and show your destined journey in the form of Origami and quilling.

Rules and regulations:

- 1. This is only for IISc students. Come along with the id cards.
- 2. This is a theme based competition
- 3. Each team will make a 2D/3D craftwork on the A3 sheet provided.
- 4. The participants will be provided with 1 A3 sheet, origami papers, quilling paper strips and glue.
- 5. The participants need to bring their own stationery materials(pencil, scissors, quilling tool etc.)
- 6. Time duration of the competition is 1 hr.
- 7. Make sure to reach the venue at least 20 min in advance.
- 8. No mobile phones allowed during the competition, if any found will lead to disqualification.
- 9. Any other rules(if any) will be shared at the time of event.
- 10. Change of venue (if any) will be conveyed to the participants.

Judging Criteria:

Thematic relevance, Creativity, Innovation, Neatness.

Note: In case of conflicts, decision of the judges would be considered final and the scoresheet of each judge will be provided to participating teams.



ArtSci: Expressing science (your work) through art.

Venue: Old Physics Building

Timing: 3rd August 2019: 11:30 -13:00

Registration Deadline: 2nd August 2019 (midnight), 23:59

Art is communication. It communicates the artist's self-expression, emotions or idea. For researchers used to describing their work in academic papers, distilling their research down to one picture (dance/song/poem/animation) can present a challenge. Let's explore if it is easier to explain your research and the importance of what you do through an artwork than it is to use words on a page. Participant can represent his/her work through any form of art like dancing, singing, comedy or any other form of acting, cartoon movies etc. in the given time.

Rules:

- 1. Only open to IISc students.
- 2. Team size: Solo
- 3. Single round event.
- 4. Participant can represent his/her work through any art. (song/dance/painting/animation etc.)
- 5. In case of more than 20 entries: the first-come, first-served rule will be followed.
- 6. Each participant will be given EXACTLY 4+1 minutes to represent his/her work. Participants are to stick to the time limit strictly.
- 7. Participants should arrive 30 minutes before the event.
- 8. No use of abusive language is permitted.
- 9. Detected plagiarism of content or use of inappropriate language will lead to negative marking or disqualification.
- 10. Further rules will be explained at the venue.
- 11. The decision of the judges shall be final and binding.

Judging Criteria:

Clarity, Creativity, Effort

Note: Participants should carry ID card.

Description:

Rules and regulations:

- 1. This is a solo event meant only for IISc students, keep your ID cards with you.

- 3. The participants are required to bring their own drawing sheet the size of the drawing sheet is restricted to A3. You are free to bring your own canvas or any other working surface that you are comfortable with.
- 4. The participants will have to bring their own colours, pencils and whatever stationary is required for painting/sketching. Any type of colours are allowed water colour, acrylic, wax crayons etc.
- 5. Time duration of the competition is 1.5 hrs.
- 6. Make sure to reach the venue at least 20 min in advance.
- 7. No mobile phones allowed during the competition, if any found will lead to disqualification.
- 8. Any other rules(if any) will be shared at the time of event.
- 9. Change of venue (if any) will be conveyed to the participants.

Judging Criteria:

Thematic relevance, Creativity, Painting/Sketching skills, Neatness.

Note: In case of conflicts, decision of the judges would be considered final and the scoresheet of each judge will be provided to participating teams.

- 4. You will not be provided any stationary items like pen, pencil, blank paper etc. its a treasure hunt so you are free to carry anything you want/need during the event.
- 5. you are free to utilize any resource (your smartphone, internet etc), take help of your friend in solving clues/doing tasks in the event.
- 6. The participants will have to retain all the clues as a proof of reaching the destination.
- 7. The participants will have to complete each task successively to avoid elimination, and move on to the next level.ext level.
- 6. Further rules will be explained at the venue.
- 7. The decision of the judges/organizers shall be final and binding.

RULES:

- 4. The main goal is to make a meal that will firstly be healthy,
- 5. Food ingredients and utensils are to be brought by the competitors. Strictly no sharing anything with other teams. If its seen or caught doing this, it ends in disqualification of both the teams
- 6. They have a time limit of 90 minutes. Exceeding that shall lead to deduction of points.
- 7. Cleanliness and hygiene should be maintained
- 8. No alcohol or intoxicating substances are not allowed.
- 9. You can't bring cooked food.
- 10. Dry food like biscuits bread flavouring agents sugar salts nuts raisins different fried foods is allowed. You can bring different juices ice cream condensed milk and other non cooked food.
- 11. Mobile phones or other communication devices are not allowed. You can be disqualified if caught or found.
- 12. Judges make the final call.

Deduct maximum 5 marks for:-

- 1. Unhealthy food
- 2. Cooked food
- 3. Overtime
- 4. Did they use communication devices?
- 5. Plagiarism
